Building Empires	A study of how societies respond to geographic changes in Japan and on the Mongol Steppe.
World Trade & Expansion	A study of how trade and exchange is rooted in an imbalance of power including a brief look at the results of Imperialism.
Modern Globalization	A study of how contemporary states/countries are interconnected.
